Household trash/junk/debris – removal/disposal options!

- Laketon Township offers a discount card to use at the Muskegon County Landfill giving a discount twice per calendar year. This card is available to Laketon Township residents only – limit one card per household per calendar year, visit the township hall to pick up a card. You must provide ID.
