#### When You Call Laketon

When you call Laketon Township a "real person" will answer the phone unless the office is closed or all lines are in use with other callers. You will then be directed by the answering machine to leave a message and your call will be returned as soon as possible.

## PUBLIC SAFETY MILLAGE RENEWAL REQUEST TO MAINTAIN POLICE & FIRE SERVICES

In 2004 Laketon Township voters approved a millage for public safety in the amount of 2 mills (\$2.00 for every thousand dollars of taxable value). The millage request was approved for a period of five years, which covered 2004 thru 2008. The public safety millage covers the following public safety expenses: the cost of one(1) Muskegon County Sheriff's Deputy to patrol Laketon Township 5 days per week, the cost of a contract with Muskegon Charter Township Fire Department for fire coverage in Laketon Township and the cost of fire hydrant fees for fire hydrants located in Laketon Township.

Laketon Township will again be asking voters to approve this public safety funding as a **millage renewal** at the election to be held on May 5, 2009. This is a request to renew the previously approved millage, **not an increase** in millage. This funding is needed in order for Laketon Township to pay for police and fire services.

Laketon Township currently pays for one(1) deputy from the Muskegon County Sheriff's Department to be dedicated to patrolling within Laketon Township boundaries only. The deputy is available to quickly respond to all types calls from burglaries to traffic accidents. The deputy also watches for speeding traffic in school zones and other areas. Property Checks are another service provided. If you are away from home on vacation or for any other reason the deputy will periodically check on the home. You only need to fill out a brief request form at Laketon Township Hall before you leave town. With Muskegon Charter Township Fire Department services, Laketon Township currently enjoys an excellent fire rating from Insurance Services Organization (ISO Class 5). This number is very important to every homeowner because the better the rating, the lower your homeowner's insurance rates. For example: insurance on a Laketon Township home with a replacement cost of \$150,000 at ISO Class 10 would be \$1079 per year but with an ISO Class 5 it would be \$858 per year: a \$221 savings—estimates provided by Sheldon Parrish of Farm Bureau Insurance. If this example home had a \$75,000 taxable value this 2 mills for public safety would cost \$150 per year. In this example, a homeowner would see a monetary savings of \$71 per year. A homeowner would also have the peace of mind that their home (which is often a family's single largest investment) is protected by the services of an excellent fire department. In addition to fires, the fire department responds to other emergencies such as traffic accidents with trained medical personnel.

We all hope we will never have need of these services, but when an emergency situation occurs police and fire services are essential to the safety and security of ourselves and our loved ones as well as our homes and property. Please remember to vote on Tuesday May 5, 2009.

## Snow Plowing Reminders

Laketon Township receives many calls regarding snow plowing questions and complaints every year. While we are hopeful that spring is around the corner and our snowplowing season is almost over we would like to issue a few friendly reminders about snowplowing do's and don'ts.

- **Do Not**—plow snow across or into public roadways in any way, this is against State Law & police can issue tickets.
- **Do Not**—blow snow into public roadways in any way, this is also against State Law.
- **Do**—try keep snow banks as low as possible near driveway entrances in order to keep site lines clear for safe entrance onto public roads.
- **Do**—for safety purposes be observant of traffic traveling the road when plowing or blowing snow.
- **Do**—try to remember to shovel out your mailbox so mail carriers can deliver you mail in a timely manner. Thank you for your consideration.

## Spring Water/Sewer Construction

Construction on the water and sewer lines will be starting again in the spring. Our best estimate at this time is sometime after March 1st, 2009. Of course this is dependent upon the weather and the weight restrictions on the roads being lifted so that heavy trucks and equipment can again be transported on the roads. ## New Ordinance on Outdoor Furnaces

A few months ago, Laketon Township adopted an ordinance to regulate the construction and operation of outdoor furnaces. The Laketon Township Planning Commission worked for many months to create an ordinance that would promote and secure the "public health, comfort, convenience, safety, welfare and prosperity" for our residents.

These outdoor furnaces, which burn wood and other solid fuels, are increasing in popularity as an alternative to traditional heating sources such as natural gas, propane, fuel oil and electricity as these fuels increase in price. However, it is generally recognized that these devices can cause smoke, soot, fumes, odors, air pollution etc, that can be detrimental to citizens health and can deprive neighboring citizens of the enjoyment of their property.

The ordinance determines the areas where outdoor furnaces can be installed, requires permits and inspections, establishes setbacks from property lines and all structures/buildings among other requirements and regulations. As for existing outdoor furnaces that were installed prior to the ordinance: the ordinance requires that all existing outdoor furnaces be brought into "compliance with the requirements hereof as near as is practically possible". Also, permit fees will be waived for existing outdoor furnaces until September 29, 2009. However, if a permit is not obtained by that date, all permit fees will be "re-instated in full".
